



Volunteer Opportunities for Medical Professionals

Volunteer Physicians and Specialists (MD, DO, NP, PA):

- ❖ 100+ doctors, Nurse Practitioners and Physicians Assistants currently donate their time and talents at our modern, well-equipped health center, providing basic primary care and a variety of specialty services
- ❖ Physicians can volunteer a few hours a week, a few hours a month.
- ❖ Physicians can either engage solely in patient care or participate in our teaching programs, which include all Chicago-area medical schools and many residency training programs.
- ❖ **CommunityHealth is looking to recruit volunteer specialty physicians in the following areas:**
 - Rheumatology**
 - Urology**
 - Ophthalmology**
 - Neurology**
- ❖ **We are also consistently recruiting Polish speaking physicians and interpreters.**

Volunteer Nurses and Physicians Assistants (RN):

- ❖ RN, NP, and PA volunteers at CH have the opportunity to conduct one on one patient visits for medication refills and health education under the supervision of a staff nurse.

Volunteer Pharmacists (RPh, PharmD)

- ❖ The pharmacy fills prescriptions for uninsured, low-income patients seen at CommunityHealth and other clinics across the city. The pharmacy utilizes a formulary based on donated brand-name medications from pharmaceutical companies, plus stock generic medications.
- ❖ Pharmacists, with a valid Illinois license, are needed to work in the pharmacy Mon-Thurs evenings and Saturday mornings.
- ❖ Pharmacist work with technicians, students, and other volunteers to dispense prescriptions. We are seeking volunteer pharmacists willing to work 3-4 hour shifts once a month.
- ❖ Responsibilities include filling prescriptions, counseling patients, and assisting in the coordination of care. Ordering medications or billing third-parties is not required.
