Volunteer Primary Care and Specialty Providers (MD, DO, NP, PA)

Volunteer physicians, nurse practitioners and physicians assistants are integral to our mission to provide quality primary care and a variety of specialty services to CommunityHealth patients. Volunteer providers are needed in the areas of primary care as well as over 24 specialties. There is particular need for Dermatology, ENT, Endocrinology, Podiatry and Rheumatology. Providers must be currently licensed and board certified.

Volunteer Nurses (RN)

Volunteering as a nurse at CommunityHealth, is a unique opportunity where nursing skills and critical thinking abilities will be utilized in providing one-on-one patient care and education. Volunteering as a nurse at CommunityHealth is different than other volunteer clinic settings, because nurses at CommunityHealth work independently, seeing their own patients for medication refills and blood pressure checks. While these are the main categories of RN visits, nurse appointments frequently encompass patient health education, medication management and instruction and volunteer nurses are often faced with critical patient concerns that require immediate follow-up with providers and staff nurses. While challenging, this is an incredibly rewarding volunteer opportunity where you will be able to make a direct impact with every volunteer encounter. Volunteer Nurses must have 1 year of professional nursing experience.
